This is one of the largest gatherings of decision makers of one of largest Christian denominations in the world. In addition, much will be made about discussions and legislation around human sexuality. You may know that the UMC has been collectively grappling over our social and theological approach to human sexuality for the better part of half a century. All of this will bring with it a decent amount of media coverage. Media coverage will mean reports, opinions and speculation coming from a variety of sources.

I have not been ordained in the Methodist Church long, but as the child of Methodist clergy, I have been part of the church long enough to know that if one thing can be absolutely GUARANTEED it is that nothing happens quickly. My biggest piece of advice and what I want to ask of you is to not believe everything you see or hear from anyone. Even if the source is reliable, the vast majority of sources do not understand the way the United Methodist Political engine works. Even if they do, they do not have time or desire to explain it to you, but would more likely rather push their headline. Please know that I am abreast to what is happening and so is your local church leadership. We are committed to keeping you updated if/when there are things necessary to be communicated. Be patient and trust us that any communication that comes from me/us will be the information you would actually need to know.

# They Call Us To Gather.....

It was ten years ago and right before Easter Sunday, as Suzanne Long recalls, when several of the congregation had gathered to go through and clean out the closets. Suzanne opened one of the doors and found banners for Christmas and a few others she had never seen used in the church Sanctuary. That got her to thinking that it would be so nice to start hanging banners in our Sanctuary. Suzanne got busy; she researched the sizes that would be appropriate and the symbols and artwork that would be in her designs for the banners. She figured out how to cut the yardage to gain the most and best use of the fabrics planned. She then put together what we enjoy today.

The banners that were hanging in the Sanctuary on the morning of Palm Sunday were her very first creations. These creations were so appropriate and as I looked around at them that morning, they represented the scripture of Matthew 21:1-11 by sharing the story of Jesus when he enters Jerusalem as King; the story of the palms: Palm Sunday. This was all reflected in our worship on Sunday as the children entered the sanctuary waving their palms and traversed through the aisles waving and smiling and sharing their joy and awe with us.

As I researched the history of banners in Christianity, I learned that they have been a part of our scripture heritage since the earliest biblical writings. They welcome us as children of God to prepare us for worship; to be mindful of God's presence among us. Banners remind us of scripture relevant to the seasons and time of worship such as Lent, Pentecost, and Christmas. These meanings and themes are our visual symbols of our Christian heritage and the sanctity of worship.

Doreen Kellogg, in her article "Lift a Banner in the Land!" shares that they represent how God's people use the banners to help us understand how we can use them today to create a meaningful part of gathering for worship and how we are being called to serve. Suzanne's creativity in scriptural banner resources is her spiritual gift shared amongst our congregation. Her symbolism provides a focus on God and his message for us each Sunday while we are gathered as a community of faith.

Suzanne and Scott Long have long been decorating our Sanctuary for worship during our Lent and Christmas seasons. We are joyful and thankful for their gifts to serve.

# STEWARDSHIP SPOTLIGHT

#### Financial Advice from Babylonia to Centralia

French writer Jean-Baptiste Alphonse Karr wrote "plus ca change, plus c'est la meme chose" or the more things change, the more they stay the same. This adage is proven in a book titled *The Richest Man in Babylon: Six Laws of Wealth*, authored by Charles Conrad. The Babylonians didn't have a bitcoin market to invest in and probably invested in chariots rather than electric cars, but the more things change, the more they stay the same. Conrad cites six financial principles that guided the richest man in Babylon and still ring true for Centralians today.

The first financial principle is to "Keep a part of all you earn. Save at least 10% of your income." This concept is often referred to as paying ourselves first. Under this principle we are to set aside a portion of our income to add to savings/investment each month. This is done at the beginning of the month; if we wait until the end we might not have anything left over. Paying ourselves first prioritizes the importance of doing so, much as tithing and giving our first fruits to God does. Paying ourselves and God first is directing our money where to go. As Dave Ramsey has said, if we don't tell our money where to go, it will soon disappear on its own.

The second financial principle is to "Put your savings to work for you. Invest it so that it will multiply." Setting aside money for ourselves each month is a great and necessary first step. However, to outpace inflation, something more is needed. We must draw interest on that money. As we establish a "rainy day emergency fund" to prepare for the inevitable rainstorm, the focus is on keeping our money safe and secure. Bank accounts and CDs are safe havens for this. There are numerous high yield savings accounts and CD's that are above 4-5% presently. This is substantially better than many savings accounts which may pay .10 percent. Through the years, that interest disparity can make a shocking difference. Once an emergency fund of 3-6 months expenses is covered, then the move can be made to invest money in stocks to grow our wealth even more. Historically, the stock market has averaged around a 10% return on money invested. Financial sage Warren Buffett believes that an index fund is the safest and smartest way for most of us to invest. An index fund invests in the entire market providing ultimate diversification and typically good returns. There may be great years of 50%+ returns and there could be terrible years of -50% returns, but over the long haul historically the return has averaged a gain of around 10%.

The third financial principle is "Avoid debt. The poor pay interest while the rich earn interest." It's been said that it's better to give than receive, and that is true over most situations. However, rest assured that it's not better to give interest rather than receive interest. In fact, the reverse is true. Several years ago, I used a Covid relief check to pay off my remaining car loan. I eliminated a car payment with 5% interest and started investing that car payment and receiving interest. I believe I read that 70% of Americans spent their Covid relief checks on big screen televisions. In the long term I was happier with my choice. Credit card debt of 20% plus can truly make us a slave to the lender. Covetousness and our unwillingness to delay gratification don't serve our finances well. Dave Ramsey offers this advice: Don't try to keep up with the Joneses. THEY'RE BROKE.

The fourth financial principle is "Don't speculate in get-rich-quick schemes. Invest in said businesses that you understand." Earlier I mentioned that a lot of us aren't big fans of the concept of delayed gratification. This can cause us trouble when we want wealth but don't want to work for it or wait for it. Uncle Ed says that I will easily double my money in Ethereum — maybe so, maybe not. Where there is high reward potential, there is typically incredible risk. I don't have much understanding of bitcoin, but I do know about McDonald's burgers, Nike's shoes, and Walmart stores. None of those businesses will double my money overnight, but over time the trend is typically up for these businesses, with some dips and spikes along the way.

The fifth financial principle is "Invest in yourself. Gain knowledge and skills to increase your earning power." Never stop learning. One of the best ways we can make ourselves more valuable is to gain new skills. We can look at those above us at work and figure out what skills we need to move to the next level. If investing is interesting, we can read up on it or talk to people we know who are successful at it. Persistence and perseverance will serve us well along the way as we invest in ourselves.

#### Financial Advice from Babylonia to Centralia

The sixth and final financial principle mentioned is "Safeguard your growing fortune with diversification and insurance." Most of us are familiar with the concept of not putting all our eggs in one basket. If I put all my money in Walmart stock and thenWalmart stock crashes, I'll end up in big trouble. Our goal should be to diversify by investing in different business and different industries, or probably even smarter by investing in an index fund. We must also insure our cars, homes, and lives to protect against catastrophes. A blink of an eye car wreck, tornado, or unexpected illness can wipe away a lifetime of savings and investment if we're not properly insured. The principles for financial security are the same for Centralians today as for Babylonians centuries ago. The more things change, the more they stay the same.
